

How to install and start using the Lumi app on your computer?

Download and install the Lumi application:

Visit the Lumi Education website (<https://lumi.education/en/lumi-h5p-offline-desktop-editor/>) and download the installation file for your operating system (Windows, Mac or Linux). Follow the on-screen instructions to install the application on your computer.




Launching the application:

Click on the Lumi icon to open the Lumi desktop application.

Creating new content, or selecting a content type:

Activity Hub displays a list of all available H5P content types (eg Course Presentation, Interactive Video, Quizzes). Choose the type of content you want to create, for the purposes of this task it is Timeline, type the word "timeline" in the search field and start creating interactive content by clicking on the "Details" button, and then on the "Use" button.



Content creation:

The selected content type will open in the editor, where you can add text, images, videos, and other interactive elements. If you are creating a timeline, there are three main parts: Title (content), Timeline (points in time that you will define one by one), and dates, start and end (you can enter just the year, month and day are not necessary).

To add 1 point on the timeline, you need to have prepared the headline text for that point (en. *Headline*), then the description text (en. *Body Text*) which can be from one sentence to a couple of paragraphs – if you need to add more text, maybe put a link to that longer text, or its source, of course you can also add an image or video in the Media field. In addition to individual points in time, you can also specify entire eras within which multiple points are grouped (say, if you are making a timeline about literary theory, you can mark part of the timeline as Romanticism and specify which year it extends from to which year).

Storage and export:

You can save your work within the app. When you're done, you can download the content as

.h5p file or as a standalone HTML file that can be shared with others or uploaded to a learning management system (LMS).
